AG-ceptional Woman of the Year 2016

To say I am honored to receive this award would be an understatement. I think back to my first Ag-ceptional Woman's Conference and I remember going home with excitement and full of energy. That first conference started me on a journey I could never have imagined. I felt empowered, and the contributions I was making to our farm now seemed to hold more value. I heard about the Nebraska LEAD program at a break out session and decided to apply. After being accepted, I began an incredible 2-year journey learning agricultural leadership skill and meeting extraordinary people passionate about agriculture. After the LEAD program, I ran for the Nebraska Soybean Board (NSB) and now begin my third year working to create markets for Nebraska's second largest cash crop. As the

only woman on this nine-person commodity board, I believe I bring a unique perspective and hope I contribute in valuable ways. I also currently hold a seat on the United States Farmers and Ranchers Alliance (USFRA) Board of Directors. USFRA consists of more than 100 farmer and rancher led organizations and agricultural partners representing virtually all aspects of agriculture, working to engage in dialogue with consumers who have questions about how today's food is grown and raised. Now I get to be part of telling our story of growing healthy food with less resources in a sustainable way on a much larger scale.

I have been blessed to marry into a hard-working family who made farming a way of life. We work together when weeds need chopped; hay is mowed, raked, and baled; cattle need vaccinations and treatment; and during long days of planting and harvest. Working on a farm means that our children work alongside us. Jim and I hope to have raised 3 authentic children who value working until the job is done and find ways to develop their talents to make this world a better place. 4-H and FFA are an integral part of our family life weaving the values of agriculture in almost everything we do. Justine pursued her love of all things that grow with a horticulture degree from SDSU in Brookings, SD and found work with Zangger Popcorn developing quality genetics for seed. She has blessed us with a remarkable son-in-law from Burwell who works with his hands in building construction. Jonathon received his degree in Agronomy from Northeast and is pursuing a second degree in Diesel Technology – we are so fortunate to have a quality community college in northeast Nebraska preparing young men and women for careers in ag. Marie is a senior at Pope John Central Catholic this year and plans to share the message of growing food and raising livestock through an agricultural communications degree.

Growing up on a farm raising hogs near Tilden with my mother and father and six siblings, I learned solid values and importance of family. After marrying Jim in 1987, Jim (Sr.) and Shirley Meis welcomed me into their family and I've watched them go from very humble circumstances to a legacy we hope to continue. Working beside my brother-in-law Joe and his wife Pam, I witness solid never-ending commitment to building a farm operation to be proud of. Most of all, my husband Jim, with patient persistence, has shown me that we could work side by side and work toward common goals. I would like to thank Mrs. Julia Schwartz for nominating me. Every day she teaches young people about ag and has built an admirable FFA program that benefits our community and so many students.

I would also like to thank Dennis and Lynelle Morgan who produce a quality newspaper in our town promoting agriculture and spoke so highly of me in the video. I look around my neighborhood and see real farm women whom I admire like Alice and Nancy who never leave the house without their pliers. Or Linda who carried on her farm after her husband Randy passed away, way to young, and left her to manage the farm and raise two young children.

And finally, thank you to the truly Ag-ceptional women led by Corinne Morris who work tirelessly to organize the best darn conference around!
