**MINUTES**

1. Julie Robinson, Chairperson of the Student Success Committee, convened the meeting at 1:34 p.m. in Suite G of the Lifelong Learning Center.
2. Recommended approval of the Minutes of the November 14, 2019 meeting as distributed.
3. Dr. Michele Gill and Makala Williams reported that Early College is a program through which students under 19 years of age who have not graduated from high school may enroll in college courses at the 1000 level or higher. Dual credit students are awarded both high school and college credit for a course.

2018-2019 Early College credit hours generated are reported at 8,751 hours which is 10.1 percent of the total 2018-2019 credit hours generated, which equated to 292 full-time equivalent students.

Early College delivery methods include classes taught in the high school by a qualified high school teacher, Northeast face-to-face classes, and Northeast distance delivery via online or ITV classes.

Early College Pathways encompass academic transfer which includes general education courses that are part of the Nebraska Transfer Initiative and Career and Technical Education (CTE) which includes Fridays @ Northeast classes, Pathways 2 Tomorrow (P2T), and CTE classes taught at the high school by qualified CTE teachers.
