

The unique partnership between Northeast Community College and the University Nebraska Medical Center allows students interested in pursuing a bachelor's degree in nursing the opportunity to complete general education requirements at Northeast and continue to attend classes for nursing in Norfolk at UNMC's College of Nursing - Northern Division. Students must earn a grade of "C+" or above in all courses listed below to ensure eligibility of transfer credit. A current CNA certification is also required by UNMC. Admission into the UNMC BSN program is selective and very competitive. A separate application is required for admission to UNMC. While a minimum prerequisite grade point average of 3.0 is required, the average GPA for successful applicants admitted to the BSN program is 3.30 or higher on a 4.0 scale.

## NURSING – UNMC Transfer

Nursing presents many options and specialties. There is a great demand for nurses at all levels and in all care-settings including hospitals, outpatient centers, clinics, nursing homes, and community agencies.

A registered nurse (RN) can begin their nursing career by earning an Associate Degree in Nursing or a Bachelor of Sciences in Nursing (BSN).

Northeast offers an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) with the option of continuing their education for a BSN via partnership with a 4-year institution. An ADN graduate is eligible to take the NCLEX-RN exam.

UNMC offers a traditional BSN program and an RN to BSN program. Completing the AS degree, as outlined on the reverse side of this handout, will prepare a student to apply for UNMC's traditional BSN program.

Both Northeast and UNMC nursing programs utilize a selective application process and accepts a set number of the highest scoring applicants. The application deadline is February 1. Please contact the Nursing Program Specialist for details at 402.844.7320.

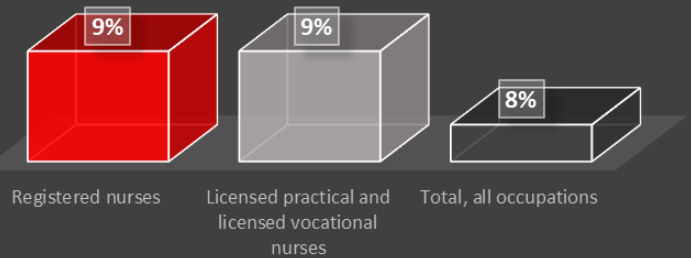

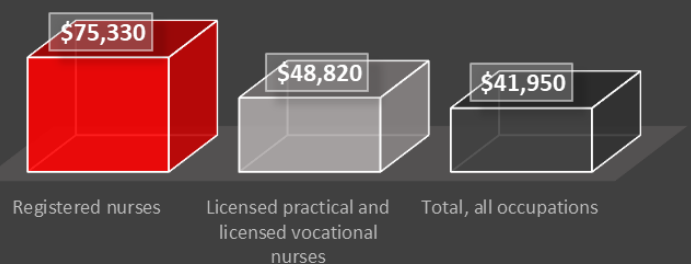
